VETERAN PROCLAMATION

The following proclamation was read:

EXECUTIVE PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, we salute our brave men and women who as Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, and Airman honorably served the United States in wars, campaigns, and expeditions on foreign soil and in hostile waters, with Auxiliary membership of men and women who have honorably served in America’s Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, we embrace our responsibility to help our Veterans and their family heal from the heavy tolls of war. We remember men and women for having borne the heaviest cost of war; and

WHEREAS, we pay tribute to all brave patriots who serve valiantly under difficult circumstances and those that made the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, we also pay tribute to all brave patriots who suffered as prisoners of war and we stand steadfast in our commitment not to rest until we account for the heroes who have not yet returned to American soil; and

WHEREAS, service members of different backgrounds, races, and creeds have come together to complete daunting missions.
